This letter responds to your application to the U.S. Department of Education (Department) regarding the Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC) for approval of an ability-to-benefit (ATB) State process to allow students without high school diplomas to receive Federal student financial aid under the programs authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act, as amended, while enrolled in an eligible career pathway program.

The Department has reviewed your application and determined that it is materially complete, and your application is approved. Your State Process will be approved until August 17, 2028.

Participating institutions must now indicate in the Department's Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) that a student has qualified for ATB under the "State Process" by submitting a Student Eligibility Code (SEC) value of "03-State Process" and then entering the required approved state in the Ability to Benefit State Code field.
